V. BOARD BUSINESS

- A. A resolution declaring it necessary to levy an additional tax for the purpose of current expenses and requesting the summit county fiscal officer to certify the total current tax valuation of the school district and the dollar amount of revenue that would be generated by that additional levy, pursuant to sections 5705.03 and 5705.21 of the revised code.
- B. A resolution (a) declaring it necessary to raise annually an additional amount for school district purposes and requesting the state tax commissioner to estimate the respective rates at which it would be necessary to levy (i) an ad valorem property tax and (ii) a school district income tax on the earned income of individuals residing in the school district, to produce that amount, and (b) proposing to reduce the rate of the school district's existing 1.9-mill tax being levied for a continuing period of time for the purpose of current expenses, pursuant to section 5748.02 of the revised code.
