747 qualify for free lunches and 191 qualify for reduced, for a total of 938, an increase of 43 from 2016. Adding preschool helped contribute to the increase.

A total of 218,091 lunches were served and 49,592 breakfast this school year.

- Preschool was added to our program at Grill School. The morning class was offered breakfast and the afternoon class lunch.
- Our lunch count was up, but our breakfast count was down from last year, 3 snow day, 8
  days for moving to the new building and 10 days at the high school for testing contributed to
  a loss in revenue compounded by the expense still incurred with payroll.
- Food Service Department provided and paid for, out of our budget breakfast December 2<sup>nd</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup> for all 3<sup>rd</sup> graders the day of their testing.
- Panther Pizzeria is a huge success at our new high school. We average selling 26 pizzas per day. They love the variety made each day.
- Panther Stomping Grounds is another big hit at the new high school. Coffee isn't the big seller but the Latte, Frappuccino, Smoothies, and Lemonade's are their favorites. We averaged 100 to 125 cups per day in sales.
- We are participating in "Farm to School" by using a local farm Bauman Orchards for our fresh fruit served for breakfast and lunch.

Once again regulations are changing for next year.
